Chapter Coordinator FAQ

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Q: What Is A Chapter Coordinator?

A: A Chapter Coordinator is the Club Member in a state or region with three or more current Club Members and no existing Chapter Coordinator. The Chapter Coordinator is the person acting on behalf of The Lincoln Mark VII Club in their state or region. The Chapter Coordinator is the local liaison between the Club and it's Members and Sponsors. The Chapter Coordinator receives and distributes sponsored items and funding on behalf of The Lincoln Mark VII Club in their state or region.

Q: What does a Chapter Coordinator do?

A: The Chapter Coordinator acts as the focal point of connection for the region and answers questions about The Lincoln Mark VII Club, events, solutions, and Membership. The Chapter Coordinator helps to coordinate Events by meeting and greeting enthusiasts, answering Club related questions, and distributing items. The Chapter Coordinator may organize fundraisers and solicit local businesses on behalf of The Lincoln Mark VII Club in their state or region, with permission from the Chairman of The Board. The Chapter Coordinator can also receive national assistance from The Lincoln Mark VII Club, to facilitate operating a Chapter. The Chapter Coordinator provides local marketing and advertising of The Lincoln Mark VII Club through flyers and banners and activities. The Chapter Coordinator reports to the Chairman Of The Board.

Q: Who can be a Chapter Coordinator?

A: A Chapter Coordinator is a Club Member that is a resident of the state or region in which they elect to coordinate. A Chapter Coordinator is someone who is sympathetic to the restoration, preservation, and maintenance of the Lincoln Mark VII. Chapter Coordinators may only be appointed by a majority vote of the seated Board Of Directors.
